## JULY 2004 NEWSLETTER

JOHN HOLMGREN gives this reminiscence about Moraga 50 years ago.

"I moved to Orinda in 1951 and on weekends I would often ride my bike down to Moraga. There wasn't much there. On the right side of the road stood the Moraga Barn which at one time served as a train station. The trains that stopped here originated in Stockton and eventually ran into Oakland. In addition to the Moraga Barn there was a group of red wooden buildings on the east side of Moraga Way. These were part of a complex called the Moraga Ranch Company and consisted of a cook house, commissary and a mess hall. In 1914 the Ranch had a garage, a repair shop, several bunk houses and a blacksmith shop. There was a village for migrant workers nearby, plenty of barns, a few houses and corrals and even a real estate office.

The Moraga Ranch company has been owned and operated by the Bruzzone family from its very beginnings. John Bruzzone was the original owner. He is deceased but his wife, Joan, still manages the property. At one time it had pears and walnuts but they are not harvested anymore. Across from the ranch just south of the present-day Moraga post office, is the Moraga Barn. It was originally built as a hotel and stage stop. Moraga became an important stop for the Sacramento Northern Railroad.

Another railroad called the Oakland, Antioch and Eastern was an electric line. It ran coaches out to Redwood Canyon called "Picnic Specials". A park was established in the canyon and a merry-go-round was built. The park became so popular it was necessary for visitors to make reservations well in advance. The park was active from 1914 until the 1930's.

Trains once operated along a line that ran across the St. Mary's College campus. They operated from March 1913 until March, 1957. The rails eventually extended from Oakland to Sacramento. They passed the little town of Canyon, went through a tunnel continued along the north edge of Lake Temescal and went down Shafter Avenue in the heart of Oakland.

## Following The Rules:

7. You MAY NOT smoke cigarettes.
8. You MAY NOT dress in bright colours.
9. You may UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES dye your hair.
10. You must wear AT LEAST two petticoats.
11. Your dresses must NOT be any shorter than two inches above the ankle.
12. To Keep the school room clean you must:
  - sweep the floor at least once daily.
  - scrub the floor with hot soapy water at least once a week.
  - clean the blackboard at least once a day.
  - start the fire at 7 a.m. so that the room will be warm by 8 a.m.
